

They also provide cold weather shelter. *Halifax Urban Ministries* is open



Homeless Prevention & Intervention

7 days a week from 8:30am to 3:30pm for financial and food assistance and 5:00pm until 8:00pm for laundry and showers. They also provide haircuts the first Monday of each month. *Halifax Urban Ministries* is in need of the following:



<u>Canned Goods:</u> Gallon sized cans of fruit and vegetables (for the hot meals program), canned goods such as vegetables, pastas (ravioli, spaghetti & meatballs, etc), beans, tuna corned beef, chicken, Vienna Sausages, canned fruit.

<u>Dry Goods:</u> Pasta (spaghetti, macaroni, etc.), pancake mix, cereal, macaroni & cheese, Hamburger Helper, rice, beans, cereal bars, oatmeal.

Other: Pancake syrup, peanut butter, jelly.

<u>Toiletries:</u> Toilet tissue, laundry soap, dish liquid, pull ups, sanitary napkins, hair brushes and combs, washcloths and all other toiletry items.

Weekly Lenten services will be held at 6:30pm every Wednesday. Due to Covid-19 there will not be any soup suppers during this year's Lenten season.




