

An alternative high school for girls which works toward improving the quality of life for girls at risk.




Noah's Ark Preschool January 2022 – Newsletter

Hymn of this month: Lo How a Rose E'er Blooming

"This is a hymn about beholding and listening. It's about watching revelation flourish." The tune we now know first appears in a regional hymnal in 1599 as "Es Ist ein Ros Entsprungen." Michael Praetorius, a court composer in central Germany, wrote the familiar harmonization 10 years later. There have been a few changes to the text since then—more German verses were added in the 19th century, and the most common English translation was written in 1894—but essentially none to the music. Hear the song today, in church or in a mall, and you'll almost certainly hear the exact chords Praetorius picked, in the order he picked them.
