

February Need of the Month







Preventing homelessness through emergency assistance & intervening on behalf of those experiencing homelessness.

Halifax Urban Ministries is a faith based nonprofit that has served our community since 1981. Almost all of their funding is through financial donations by the local community. 94% of each dollar directly provides services to their guests. They offer homeless prevention & assistance services throughout Volusia County from HUM service centers and distributed services at 30 partner & school locations. Flagler residents may access services at their Ormond Beach locations.

There are many ways you can help HUM help our neighbors in need and make our community a better place. You can help by donating food, volunteering your time or services, attending or sponsoring a fundraiser, committing to sponsor a room at Hope Place, or introducing Halifax Urban Ministries to a friend who may want to get involved.

Please donate only non-perishable foods that are not out of date. Most needed are canned pasta, chili, beef stew, corn, green beans, pork n' beans, soup, tomato sauce, navy or pinto beans, plus peanut butter & boxed breakfast cereal, macaroni & cheese, pasta, and rice.

We also need baby items like diapers, formula and wipes and hygiene products like deodorant, shampoo, toothbrushes, razors etc.

January was a vey busy and productive month. It began, as always, with a visit from DCF, which passed with no problems. However, a lot of changes, updating of rules and procedures, enhancing "covid" do's and don'ts, and updating playground rules and regulations, will all be in the offing over the next 6 months. They will be back in May, so we have time to implement many of these "new" procedures. From our DCF visit, we went to Early Learning Coalition and their new procedures, rules, and regulations, which will also be addressed. This mostly covers education classes and certain classroom activities, so it will be a busy spring.

Our VPK children are doing beginner math, simple adding and subtracting, learning what a fraction is, graphing and sequencing. They all took their January tests, and the majority of them have reached "kindergarten" level already, with 4 months to go! Those that haven't reached the level they should be at are well on • their way. They are also learning their address, Mom and Dad's real name, and a phone number to use in a time of emergency. They also are doing beginner reading with short sentences. The real 'reading' will begin later this month. The real reading involves small books with simple sentences. Just as in years past, once they read 12 books they get a prize of their choice, and then they move on to the next set of 12 books and another prize. Their progress will be charted on the graph on my door, and as they get more "stars" the excitement continues. Some students get very competitive, while others need more pushing, however, once the prizes begin to appear, their interest climbs proportionately. The writing of their name is getting clearer and in most cases you can decipher what they are writing.

Our younger ones are learning to follow 2 and 3 step directions, getting potty trained, and learning to sit still during circle time. All major steps which require a great deal of patience on the part of our teachers.

February is also Valentines month so of course we will have a party. We will give you the details next month.

Thank you again for all of your prayers and support throughout the year.

The Hymn of the Day was "Build Us Up" a duet with Lionel Marcoux and myself at the piano. We also performed the Prelude and Postlude with a few of the choir members. On Jan 23rd, we performed, with more choir members, "The Road Home" by S. Paulus. We sung in concordance with Pastor Nate's touching message about Homecoming; ultimately freedom in Christ.

To God be all the Glory, our choir members reuniting safely to sing unto the Lord!

Hymn of the Month

Among several beautiful tunes we have sung this month I have chosen. "The Road Home"; Adapted from the song "Prospect" showcased in the Southern Harmony Songbook (1835). The melody is considered an "Early American" tune from the Colonial era. It is built on a pentatonic scale, and arranged as a homophonic hymn-like texture with few dissonances and thoughtful suspensions in the time signature 3/4 (for most of the measures); by **Stephen Paulus.

The Road Home was commissioned by the Dale Warland Singers (2001). Paulus, discovered the melody in the book "The Lone Wild Bird" and he asked his friend and colleague Michael Dennis Browne to write the lyrics. The melody masterfully harmonized by Paulus along with the nostalgic, longing-inducing lyrics by Dennis Browne, gave birth to this masterpiece that it is now part of the American Repertoire.
