

"MY ACHING HEAD"

Most of us get headaches from time to time, and they can be mild, throbbing, and last for minutes or days. They can occur from blocked sinuses, head injury, tension, or underlying problems. Most headaches begin in the many nerves of the muscles and blood vessels that surround your head, face, and neck. Stress, muscle tension, enlarged blood vessels and other triggers activate nerves, then send messages to the brain. Thus, you have a headache!

Tension headaches are the most common that people get from stress, anxiety, work, too little sleep, missed meals, or jaw clenching. Over the counter medicines help, and making lifestyle changes to relax and reduce stress will help to prevent future headaches.

Migraines are the second most common type of headaches that affect a large population, and are seen in women more than men. Migraines can be a precursor to Multiple Sclerosis. My sister had migraines as a child and was diagnosed with MS years ago. Symptoms are severe pain, and may include nausea and blurry vision. Triggers can be smells, noises, bright lights, certain foods, stress, exercise, and smoking. Avoiding these triggers, and prescription medications can help to avoid future migraines.

Cluster headaches are less common and usually occur at the same time of day or night. These are very painful, may strike one side of the head near the eye, and be sharp or burning pain. They are usually followed by a remission for weeks to months. These occur mostly in men and smokers. A visit to your doctor can help with decreasing this type of headache.

In rare cases, a headache may indicate a serious illness or injury to the brain. Don't hesitate to call your doctor and seek help immediately. Knowing what kind of headache you have could help you manage them and have a healthier life.

### **Worship Guidelines Update**

Our Church Council met on February 17 and discussed the "next steps" in our COVID protocols. With greater research, time, knowledge, testing and vaccines available, it was agreed to begin relaxing our protocols.

First off, we are moving to "recommending mask wearing" while in church. We ask everyone to respect others' personal decisions on mask wearing and distancing while in church.

Secondly, beginning March 1<sup>st</sup>, we will be returning the hymnals to the pews and returning to our full liturgy including music and hymns. Communion will be served at the Altar rail as in the past, and Ushers will assist congregants with this change. We will continue to require hand sanitizing prior to proceeding to the Altar and Worship Assistants will continue to wear masks and gloves while distributing Communion.

In that vein, we would also like to open the service to those who wish to be Communion Assistants, Lectors and Altar Guild members. A training/refresh for Communion Assistants and Lectors is scheduled for Sunday, March 13<sup>th</sup>, following the worship service. A training/refresh for Altar Guild is scheduled for Sunday, March 20<sup>th</sup>, following the worship service. If anyone is interested in serving, please plan to attend on these days. We will then schedule everyone's availability over the next month or two to participate in our Sunday services.

The church has purchased an electrostatic sprayer which will be used after every service to disinfect the sanctuary. This will be very helpful in ensuring everyone's safety. We strive for generosity and respect for others. We continue to offer prayers for those affected by COVID and for the medical teams working tirelessly. We appreciate your cooperation in keeping our neighbors safe!

February is Valentine's month, which means a pizza party and lots of candy. We didn't disappoint again this year. Valentines were exchanged, the pizza arrived, and bags of candy left for home. No one was forgotten and no tears were shed. A good day for all.

March is the beginning of the reading program. The sight words have been learned, and the VPK kids have been practicing their simple sentences. The chart is on the door of Ms. Sue's office, and they are slowly beginning to get their Dr. Seuss hat (sticker) representing the first book they have read. It won't be long before they will have read 12 books and they can pick out their first prizes. They are getting much better at adding, subtracting, and graphing as well as printing their names in freehand. The VPK kids are also learning to tell time, which is quite an adventure.

Our 3/4 year olds are doing 3-4 pages of seatwork a day to get them ready for VPK, learning to count to twenty, and learning sign language. The 2-3 year olds are learning to count to 5 in Spanish, learning their colors, and trying to get potty-trained so they can "move up" to the big room across the hall with Ms. Tina. Because this was the original church before it was remodeled, all of the bathrooms are in one area so if you are in a classroom across the hall you must be potty-trained. Though there are occasional "accidents", the students do fairly well raising their hands asking to go potty. They often are too busy playing outside to always remember to stop and go potty, so accidents do occur. This February we also celebrated the very special day, 2-22-22. We colored special hats to remind us of all the two's!

We always look forward to March, because that brings St. Patrick's Day, and spring break. We have been going to chapel every Wednesday to be with Pastor Nate, and listen to the stories he tells us. One day we got to each take a shell home to remind us of our baptism.
