
We have had an exciting summer here at Grace - filled with Confirmation Fun days, backyard BBQ's, weddings, worship, birthday celebrations and social gatherings.

WHAT'S IN YOUR PERSONAL CARE PRODUCTS?

Do you really know what's in your shampoo, makeup, shaving cream, hair dye, perfume and cologne that you're using every day? And, could they be harmful to your health? The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulates these products, however, they're not treated like drugs that have to be safe before being sold. The exceptions to this are products that treat or prevent health conditions. Examples of this are anti-dandruff shampoo and sunscreens. Chemicals found in many products can interfere or mimic the body's hormones are phthalates (a chemical used to make plastics), parabens (a preservative), triclosan (an antibacterial compound), and PFAS (a group of chemicals to make coatings to resist heat, oil, grease, stains, water)

All of those mentioned have been linked to brain development and reproduction and some to a higher risk of cancer. Another chemical found in some hair products is formaldehyde which has been linked to cancer. Talc is a common ingredient in cosmetics, and it sometimes can be contaminated with asbestos, linking it with cancer. The FDA has been doing more testing for asbestos in many talc containing products recently. So what should we do? Read the labels for products listed, although sometimes all chemicals are not listed that are in the products. Look for fragrance free products as many fragrance products have many chemicals. What we really need is more testing of products before release, and more regulations by the FDA. Talk with your healthcare provider, or pharmacist with any questions of concern about the products you use. I need to go and check all my personal care products now, yes?

First Communion Class


Are your kids wondering what the "Lord's Supper" is? Are they interested in learning more about this Lutheran sacrament and are ready to receive instruction and their own First Communion.






Noah's Ark Preschool Sept. 2022 – Newsletter

...Well, school has started, and we are busy learning all of the new rules and regulations that were instituted over the summer. VPK has a new testing program that has been in the developmental stage for 3 years. The new system has been having a series of training classes, which the VPK instructors, Marigold and Patti, as well as myself have attended by zoom, so we are ready for the first round of testing in September. We currently have 19 in the VPK program, with room for 3 more, which usually happens right around Labor Day. We started school on August 15th with 12 new students in our regular classes, and 6 new VPK students. We lost 2 twin VPK students who's father was transferred in early August out of state, which is the main reason we have 3 spots left. We currently have 51 students, as we lost one who didn't want to travel to and from South Daytona every day for school.

The playground slide is here, and it curves, so of course it is a big hit, along with the 2 safari trucks which finally arrived. The playground is basically complete for now, but as we go into the fall we will see what else we might need.

Thanks again for all of your wonderful support in July. We received over \$800.00 to buy supplies, STEM toys, and other items for the classroom. This year our classrooms are decorated with Peppa Pig, Cocomelon, Paw Patrol, Hot Air Balloons, and the Ocean. Every child started out the year with new crayons, colored pencils, construction paper, glitter, googly eyes, and other craft items needed to make every day a "Fun" Day.









The Council discussed a lot of up & coming activities for the fall of the year. Included among them was: a lay service for September 4th, because Pastor will be out of town; a short service on Sept. 11th, due to "God's Work-Our Hands" Sunday and the service project we will be working on, putting bags of toiletries together for the homeless; Reformation Sunday, the last Sunday of October; the arrival of the pumpkins on October 15th; a concert by Dr. Rickman, December 4th in the afternoon; and, last but not least, the Christmas Cantata on December 11th. In between all this, there will also be committee meetings, social club luncheons, bible study, confirmation class, and whatever else someone might think of.

The Social Club had a good turnout for the luncheon at Cracker Barrel, and is inviting everyone to join us at Halifax Plantation on September 16th. Sign up sheet is in the lobby.

We also had a discussion about the church going forward with the various committees and scheduling a meeting in September, which they plan on doing. Stay tuned for the announcements covering the committee you signed up for. We are always looking for more committee members, so just ask me about a committee and I will point out the person you will need to talk to.
