"What Are You Doing for Jesus?"

¹⁸ A certain ruler asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" ¹⁹ "Why do you call me good?" Jesus answered. "No one is good—except God alone. ²⁰ You know the commandments: 'You shall not commit adultery, you shall not murder, you shall not steal, you shall not give false testimony, honor your father and mother." ²¹ "All these I have kept since I was a boy," he said. ²² When Jesus heard this, he said to him, "You still lack one thing. Sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me." ²³ When he heard this, he became very sad, because he was very wealthy. Luke 18:18-23.

You may be wondering why I chose to begin this article with a bible verse from Luke. I chose it because a young man approached Jesus and asked Him what he must do to obtain eternal life. While I am not advocating selling all of your possessions to follow Jesus, what I would like everyone to consider is this, Grace Lutheran Church is in transition and looking to call a new pastor. Calling a new pastor is a long and sometimes arduous process. The reality of things is this, fewer people are graduating from the seminary, and more pastors are leaving their calls for greener pastures. It's a fact of life that there are more churches available than people to fill those vacancies and interim pastors don't want to stay at a church for five or six years.

Grace Lutheran is in the final stages of completing the Florida-Bahamas Synod checklist through the efforts of dedicated council members. Once this checklist is complete and the synod determines that the church can afford a pastor, the synod will then give its permission to put a call committee together to begin the call process. Know that the call process could take a very long time.

One thing a prospective candidate for a call to a church looks for is how is the congregation engaged in the life, ministry, and mission of the church? Is it a vibrant congregation with many people participating in the life, ministry, and mission of the church? Are a fair number of people involved or maybe just a few people involved? One measure of a healthy congregation is the involvement of its people in the life of the church.

If anyone has any other ideas, please feel free to share them with the Committee.








Family Renew Community gives families with children a safe, stable place to live while parents work to attain permanent housing and regain their stability.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE REPORT

To date this year, the Property committee has completed the repair of the East wall storm damage. A congregational member has volunteered the use of her lawn care service (Martin) to assist in thinning out the bird of Paradise on the east side of the church, as well as the garden in the corner by the red light on A1A. We have been very busy with trimming and manicuring the trees and bushes around the grounds.

There are many areas around the church that have been pressure washed to remove mold and mildew from the walls. Based on an extremely high water bill in the previous two months, and after a lot of investigation, we found two backflow preventers that were leaking. These have now been replaced. Our church entry doors and all exit doors are being looked at and repaired by a locksmith. Hopefully, all the door repairs will be completed in the near future. The Garden bell has been repaired and reinstalled.

We have a new sturdy, up-to-date, mailbox and post as well as new parking signs and posts. There has been a lot of work done by very few people. In addition to the above, the fountain area on the east side of the building has been revitalized.

I would like to recognize a few members that have gone above and beyond to facilitate these repairs and upgrades. Jim Heffner, for all his hard-work, wherever needed. Ken Pitt, for his skills with a chainsaw. Frank Quel, working diligently to remove weeds and manicure the mulch beds. Mare Koehneke for all her hard work in maintaining our memorial garden. We also cannot forget, Bill Lort, for his work in many areas including repair of the sprinkler lines, that no one knew existed. The hard work and dedication of these few people is greatly appreciated. Some of these repairs unfortunately have come at a high monetary cost to our church and there is still a lot to do. I want to personally thank, Ellie who is always there when she is needed. She stays late, and will come in on a weekend to facilitate workers that need access to our Church. This is a huge help for us!

If you are one of many who want to help out, but don't have the time or ability, there are other ways to help - just see me!
