Prayer, Do You Think About It?

Prayer is something that we do when we typically are asking forsomething from God. We pray for our family members, our friends, ourselves, and for causes, such as fundraisers that they will go well and bring in much needed revenue. However, we rarely pray to God and give thanks to Him for answering our prayer and the blessings that we have received from Him.

I think that the reason we don't think about prayer too much is because we don't quite understand it. Jesus, especially during His ministry, would often go off by Himself to pray to His father, "In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed." Mark 1:35. In the gospel of John, chapter 17, Jesus prays for His glorification, His disciples, and for all believers. When we pray, we talk to God. It is a dialogue between you and God. It is how you communicate to God and how God communicates to you. There isn't anything magical about it. It is a conversation with God similar to a conversation that you would have with your spouse or a friend.

When we pray for others, we are interceding for them with God. We are telling God that we are with whomever we are praying for, supporting them in whatever situation that they find themselves in. We are also telling the person that we are praying for that they are not alone. To pray on behalf of others is to do a good thing that pleases God, impacting both the one praying and the one being prayed for. Paul urged Timothy to pray for others, "I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people— ² for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. ³ This is good, and pleases God our Savior, ⁴ who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth." 1 Timothy 2:1-4. When we pray for something, we are petitioning God to act on our behalf to grant a certain result for a certain situation. Typically, this is the type of prayer we pray the most. It is the prayer that I prayed last year during the hurricane season. I asked God daily that any storm coming off of the coast of Africa would make a right hand turn and go up the middle of the ocean and not strike any land. Jesus prayed a prayer of petition to His father in the Garden of Gethsemane just before Judas handed Him over to the Roman authorities, "Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, "Sit here while I go over there and pray." ³⁷ He took with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee and began to be grieved and agitated. ³⁸ Then he said to them, "My soul is deeply grieved, even to death; remain here, and stay awake with me." ³⁹ And going a little farther, he threw himself on the ground and prayed, "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me, yet not what I want but what you want." Matt 6:36-39.

Prayer is not hard, but it takes a commitment to do it daily. If you find yourself having difficulty praying daily, find a time during the day when you can set aside five or ten minutes to be by yourself and talk to God. Make it a habit! God isn't going anywhere and He wants to hear from you. He already knows what is on your heart and mind, but He wants you to express those thoughts and feeling to Him.

Our Heavenly Father loves each and every one of us beyond measure. Let's show Him that we love Him too by talking to Him through our prayers.

Welcome Holy Land Christians

On May 26, 2024, during the service, we will be hearing about the Christians of the Holy Land. After the service, in the Narthex, they will have a display of handmade olive wood religious articles from Bethlehem. These articles will be available for purchase. The carvings include olivewood Nativity sets, crosses, Christmas ornaments, candle holders, angels and many other religious crafts that could make beautiful gifts. The carvings are handmade by the Christian families from Bethlehem who rely on these sales for their daily bread.

More than 70% of the Christian Community in the Holy Land depend upon tourism as their only source of income. For decades, those Christians have been enduring many hardships, since tourism in Bethlehem has plummeted. Access to other sources of income has been sharply restricted due to the ongoing conflict, the 12 yard wall built around Bethlehem, the COVID Pandemic, and the catastrophic ongoing war. Due to this, tourists are afraid and unable to visit the Holy Land. This has made it very difficult for the Christian families to find their daily bread and have forced them to immigrate and flee their homeland, since they have lost their source of income. The Christian population of the Holy Land was 30% in the last century. Today it is less than 1%. If this continues, we will find no Christians in the land of Christ over the next few years. This could cause tragic consequences for our faith and holy sites.

Please help support our Christian brothers and sisters in the town where Christ was born by purchasing their carvings. A Christian family from Bethlehem will be telling us the story of the Christians of the Holy Land. It is never too late to help. *All proceeds go to support Christian families from Bethlehem*.



(The letter below was distributed to all teachers and parents of students in Noah's Ark)

April 29, 2024

Dear Noah's Ark School Administrator, Teachers, Parents and Students,

In many ways, it doesn't seem that long ago that Noah's Ark Preschool became a part of Grace Lutheran Church. Students and parents alike spent a lot of time at the school. The administration and teachers poured their hearts and souls into teaching the children, and they learned the material well.

It is never easy to say goodbye to something that has been so worthwhile to Grace Lutheran Church, the Ormond Beach community, and the families who sent their children to this school and those who toiled countless hours preparing lessons and teaching the children.

As the Book of Ecclesiastes states:

For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven:

² a time to be born and a time to die;

a time to plant and a time to pluck up what is planted;

³ a time to kill and a time to heal;

a time to break down and a time to build up;

⁴ a time to weep and a time to laugh:

a time to mourn and a time to dance;

⁵ a time to throw away stones and a time to gather stones together;

a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing;

⁶ a time to seek and a time to lose;

a time to keep and a time to throw away;

 7 a time to tear and a time to sew;

Due to the church being in a financial position that will not allow any subsidies to help Noah's Ark remain open, it is necessary for us to close the doors at the end of the current school year. I know that this news comes as a shock to everyone and that includes the Church Council and the Congregation. The present time may seem bleak to all of us, but God tells us that He is with us as we deal with the shock and loss of closing Noah's Ark Preschool. Jeremiah 29:11-13 states, "II For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. 12 Then when you

says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. ¹² Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. ¹³ When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart." God has a plan for each and every one of us. We may not know exactly what His plan is, but it will be revealed in due time.

Please accept our sincere thank you to everyone who has ever had a part at Noah's Ark Preschool. To the administration and teachers, your dedication, caring and commitment to the church, the school and the children showed the love of Christ in all you did. To the parents of the students, your willingness to bring your child to Noah's Ark Preschool showed the love that you have for your child and/or children and your willingness to give them the best education possible. To all of the children who passed through the doors of Noah's Ark Preschool, your commitment to learning is a gift from God. As you move on, remember that Jesus is always with you no matter where you may be.
