PASTOR As we may look back on our many Easter Sundays as children, what do we remember? Do we remember the brightly colored Easter eggs or the large beautifully wrapped Easter baskets, overflowing with candy and goodies? While many of us attended Easter Sunday services with our parents, we did not fully understand the true meaning of Easter.

We enjoyed the fun of coloring eggs, and having the Easter Bunny visit our homes. We had no understanding of what the eggs and the bunny meant to Easter. In Christian tradition, Easter eggs symbolize the empty tomb from which Jesus resurrected, representing new life and rebirth. In earlier times Easter eggs were painted red to symbolize the blood Jesus shed with death on the cross. The greatest sacrifice of all.

When Jesus was born, he came into this world as a Mortal. He experienced pain and suffering, as any human would. His life wasn't one of grandeur, but that of a common man. He was born in a stable, among animals and there were no fancy garments.

Even his disciples had a difficult time believing that Jesus was truly God. They thought of him as a prophet, teacher and friend. After all, he didn't look like a God or dress like one. He looked like them, human. He didn't possess a crown or riches. Yes, they watched him perform countless miracles but never fully understood that the greatest miracle would be his resurrection from the dead and his ascension into heaven. In John 20: 1-18 we see evidence of this, as the disciples and Mary Magdalene visited the tomb early on that first day, the human body of Jesus was missing. As Jesus said to Mary Magdalene, "Do not hold onto me, because I have not yet ascended to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." They wanted the human man, Jesus, to continue his teachings and stay with them on earth. However, that was not to be. He was sent to earth to accomplish this mission, to free people from sin and give them a rebirth with God.
