June 12-14, 2025 - The Synod Assembly for the Florida-Bahamas Synod took place at the Embassy Suites in Kissimmee. Pastor Johanna Kiefner and Janet Renick represented Grace Lutheran Church.

There were 223 Lay Voting Members and 156 Rostered Voting Members.

Through Worship, Workshops, Celebrations, Elections and Fellowship times together we gathered under the theme "There is a Time for Everything", based on Ecclesiastes 3. We even had a special breakfast for Clergy With Cats!

Our featured keynote speaker was Pastor Emily Harkins of Winston-Salem, NC. She founded and pastors a church called The Dwelling, an incredibly innovative church that ministers with homeless people. She spoke about the church where she grew up - a very traditional church much different than the church she pastors today. "That church didn't just tolerate me. It invested in me." She said of most of the churches at the assembly "You are not the past. You are actually the bridge." Pastor Emily also spoke a lot about resurrection, which "doesn't just happen on Easter... look for it on a Tuesday."

Our Synod will be creating a partnership with The Dwelling.

One very exciting thing that we learned: Pastor Tom Sublett is celebrating 65 years of ordained ministry. Who does that?! A certificate of congratulations from the Synod will be presented to him at church. Congratulations, Pastor Tom!

"Remembering the coolest Pastor's Kid you'll ever meet: Michael George Koch"

I would like to share about my good friend, Michael, for those that may not have known him as well outside of church.

Michael had so many qualities that makes his absence from us on Earth leave an especially large gap. Most people in our congregation know he was my age, that he was Pastor Koch and Mrs. Linda Koch's son, that he sat on the affectionately named by Pastor Koch "Dark Side" of the pews, (closest to the "Garden of Resurrection,") and that he occasionally wore very fun patterned ties. When I started going to GLC, Caleb was a fussy 6 month old, overdue for baptism. Michael realized that Caleb responded particularly well to his blue with yellow rubber duckies necktie and he intentionally wore it on the Sundays I had Caleb with me. He never made me feel guilty for baby and toddler disruptions and he reminded me that if anyone was bothered, to ignore them. Despite having spinal bifida, Michael had the strongest backbone of anyone our age I've ever met!

He was an incredible house guest, always bringing a gift for the host, and a great one at that. I'm not sure if it was from his time working at the Wal-Mart liquor store or if he took a trip to San Sebastián Winery in Saint Augustine, but he turned my parents on to the Vintner's Red Blend when he brought a bottle to a bonfire night in our backyard. I've worked in wine and spirits sales and to this day, it's still my go-to ever since.

Michael had the warmest, genuine smile, the sincerity of which was unmistakable. His smile usually emerged following an extremely high-level, sarcastic quip that was sure to get a chuckle. His intelligence and quick wit was matched only by his determination and fierce independence. Michael's utter capability and work ethic, makes me question if he's even a Millennial, regardless of us both being 90's babies. He drove multiple cars better than I ever could even after professional lessons and no physical limitations. He is truly such an inspiration to me, personally.

ihad the honor and privilege of spending (not nearly enough) Sundays with Michael, outside of church as well. Together with Sarah and Mike Covitt, we tried to form a young adults group at GLC and successfully had a game night here, brunch at Kona, and some trivia and bingo nights we attended at multiple local spots. We started an Instagram for Grace in an effort to reach some younger Lutherans to join. (If you could, please join it, @graceormondbeach)

when it came to a team name for trivia, we brainstormed until Michael finally landed us on "Green Jell-O." Why? Because he said "it isn't really a Lutheran gathering or potluck, unless someone shows up with a big bowl of Green Jell-O!"

When it came to trivia, Michael was the guy to ask for sports questions! He particularly loved ice hockey but I can't speak much more on that since that category is NOT my forté. His excitement towards the Penguins was contagious, though! Later as our efforts for a "young adults" group kind of tapered off, we added a few members to our trivia team and tried to all wear green for winner's pictures to represent Green Jell-O! My Dad, LCDR Alex Stromski joined in, great at history questions, and Caleb's godparents Scott and Chris Ryals joined as well, with expertise in golf/geography and music, respectively. We've since lost my Dad, August 2022, Scott on Easter 2024, and now Michael joined them in Heaven this Easter, 2025.

Michael and I had a friendship that wasn't just fun and games. We also went to the movies, dinner, and brunch in groups of friends. Sometimes my best friend Janna would visit from Altamonte Springs to join us. Other times, it was just the two of us and we often had some of the most honest conversations with each other, including lots of tough love. I believe every person needs at least one friendship that includes the ability to dish and take tough-love advice. I also got to hear really fun stories from his high school days and swap anecdotes. It's no secret that Michael loved animals and they loved him right back. We joked that his parents typically had at least one dog that was like a little sister sibling to him.

Before his passing, I was thinking about Michael often. I started a remote job late last year designing flyers and Instagram marketing for a company out of Delaware that hosts bingo, karaoke and trivia events. You can't help but think of the fun memories and all of the places we visited as "Team Green Jell-O" when your job is literally to tell people how fun trivia nights are!

I never made it to Beverly Hills, with schedule, distance and transportation being my sorry excuse. I was, however, able to visit Michael in the hospital after his stroke in 2020. I snuck in my Mom's homemade buttercream icing on a chocolate brownie and a few other things I can't even remember from 5 years ago that I wanted to help jog his memory. I begged Gabriella, (the violinist from Stetson who came to play at Grace), to come and play for Michael. She couldn't make it but I think I remember having her record me something or playing some of her performance for him that Carol and Dan Schlevensky brought me to. I told Gabriella that the violinist from the hospital who was a good friend of Mrs. Koch's (and Michael's, they all worked together at Advent) came to play for him when he was unresponsive.

Michael's story in 2020, is a testimony of the miracles of God and the power of prayer. I'm sure most of you have heard it from the perspective of CaringBridge how the hospital employees were getting ready for the Hero Walk, as Michael was a proudly registered organ donor, and he grabbed the neurologist or surgeon's arm and rejoined us here on Earth, if only for a few years longer. However, I would like to take you back to 5 years ago, to my testimony, and what solidified my faith in God, my relationship with Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit...

April 2020...Every event seemed to happen so suddenly. I was playing on the floor with Caleb who was about 2 years old. I started bawling after receiving texts about the stroke that Michael suffered when we signed in to work that day on the Cardiac Floor of the Advent Health Daytona Memorial Medical Center for his routine nasal swab to test for that awful, infamous 2020 virus. Caleb turned 3 that August, and he was actually talking quite a bit. He asked me why I was crying. I explained, "you know Mommy's friend, Michael, who would wear the rubber duckie tie for you at church? I'm sad and crying because I found out he is going to Heaven." I had a mixture of emotions—anger, disbelief, many of the so-called stages of grief I was most likely experiencing while playing on the living room floor with my toddler son. Sarah Covitt was trying to text and reassure me that as an organ donor they had to work quickly and a life on life support wasn't exactly fun. Caleb, without missing a beat said to me, "Mommy don't cry, your friend is in Heaven but he is going to be right back." ... As Michael's roommate at the time, Sarah Williams Wagers (daughter of Fran Burdick) said, "out of the mouth of babes!" I think I denied Caleb's instinct or told him I hoped he was right. Caleb's words, however, didn't leave my mind.

That night, or the next, it's honestly a blur of grieving, I went over my boyfriend (at the time), Erin Morgan's house. We prayed, I cried, Erin made me hot tea. Sarah Covitt, Janna Gluck, and then Janna's Mom texted me. Her mom, Melanie, helps as a Chevra Kadisha in their Jewish Synagogue. I kept telling her Mrs. Gluck, that I couldn't accept it, I was in denial, that Caleb said Michael would come back. After all, who is more the expert on Heaven and God's Will than a child who is so freshly from there? As the night went on, I cried and prayed, prayed and cried, until finally, it was the weeping, wailing, gut-wrenching prayers that Pastor Tom McGawley spoke about at one of the Wednesday night Lenten services last year. I tearfully explained to Erin that all I had left for hope of Michael making it and coming-to, was that mustard seed worth, and that all God asks of us is that almost microscopic mustard seed of faith. As small as the chances were, I clung to that metaphorical mustard seed with all my might, with every fiber of my emotionally exhausted, sleep-deprived, dehydrated from every tear shed, being. I don't even remember what hour I fell asleep, but I remember the feeling of God's peace from the Holy Spirit wash over me, and finally acceptance of "His Will be done on Earth, as it is in Heaven," over my own selfish desires. I was content that I made my "heart's cry plea," and that God surely heard it and could make the "impossible," possible if that was "His Will" for Michael. If you ever waiver in your faith, please remind yourself you need only a mustard seed's worth to go on.

A memory that stands out so vividly both in the moment and as I write this, is a morning we spent either seeing a movie or going to brunch that he drove me back from. As the co-pilot navigating passenger, I told him that we missed or took a wrong turn, one of the many other bridges in Ormond/Daytona. He said something similar to "you've never taken this bridge? It's a great view." Even though it was way far off from our route. At the end, he admitted that he took us the long way home because we were having such great conversations and he didn't want to cut them short. I am so grateful for that day. My advice to any person reading this that wants to honor Michael's memory: slow down, enjoy this moment, and every once in a while, take the long way home.Lexi Thomas




